Order of the Eastern Star Mispillion Chapter

The Order of the Eastern Star (OES) is a volunteer-based organization. Its existence is due to the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons (Masons), a very similar organization, which began many years ago (History of the Order of the Eastern Star, n.d.). No one knows the Masons' exact origination date (FAQ's, n.d.). A chapter covers a geographical area (How GGC is organized, n.d.). The OES has a hierarchal structure that will not change (How GGC is organized, n.d.).

However, the cultural goals are clear in its traditions

(FAQ's, n.d.). Each chapter determines how to accomplish the organizational goals and vision. A group of prior members, of a local chapter that closed its operation, is in the process to attempt a new chapter in that same city. A new OES chapter has not occurred since the 1960s (OES DE GC Leader-5, personal communication, July 11, 2013). This read provides organizational background information, the problems with the former local chapter, and the work toward the changes to create a new chapter.
